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- Note that the **Feature** column describes what each point/line/polygon represents, and values can be duplicated. The **ID_Name** column shows the unique name of each particular feature (no duplication here).
 - For referrals with more than one type of Feature, (like Beetle Salvage plan showing flight results with Red-Attacked Beetle Trees and Green-Attacked trees,) please make use of the Attributes to differentiate instead of uploading several different shapefiles.
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
